Crystal Springs Mountain Lodge is a four-star self-catering resort situated at the top of Robber's Pass, on the historic old road to Pilgrim's Rest; a picturesque resort situated within 5 000 hectares of pristine countryside. Beautiful gardens combine with exquisite natural scenery to create a haven incorporating spectacular cliffs and gorges, forests, sweeping views, murmuring streams, plunging waterfalls and cool natural pools. Birdlife is plentiful and wild animals such as zebra, wildebeest, giraffe, antelope and leopard inhabit the nature reserve. The lodge architecture and face-brick and thatch structures sit well within the natural environment. Facilities abound and cater for the whole family and many activities centre around the great outdoors. Crystal Springs is conveniently situated for easy access to many of Mpumalanga's most amazing tourist attractions. From the historic, quaint town of Pilgrim's Rest to nearby Sabie and Graskop; to the spectacular Blyde River Canyon, Gods Window and the interesting rock formations of the Bourke's Luck Potholes. The world-famous Kruger National Park - home to the Big Five — is only an hour's drive from the resort.

Satara is a busy camp, and not without reason. It is situated in an excellent game viewing area, with the bush relatively open and the animals plentiful and diverse. The camp itself has a rustic charm, with the bulk of the accommodation set out in a series of circles. The camp is well wooded and the daytime bird-life is prolific. Satara is regarded as one of the best game viewing areas in the park and is particularly noted for cats, with lion, leopard and cheetah being recorded regularly. Satara, like most camps, has been artificially well wooded. The surrounding vegetation is knob thorn /marula savannah on basalt soils. A few kilometers west there is an intrusion of ecco shales soil which hosts very sweet grass often overgrazed. This intrusion also hosts Delagoa thorn thickets. To the east, the N'wanetsi region lies in Lebombo Mountain Bushveld on rhyolite soils. Tree euphorbia and red bushwillow are prevalent.

Thursday – Day 6

Lower Sabie graces the bank of the Sabie River, one of the few perennial rivers to flow through the world-renowned Kruger National Park. Visitors cannot help but feel soothed by the view of the river and the Lebombe mountains beyond, across expansive green lawns, shaded from the relentless African sun by majestic sycamore fig, marula and Natal Mahogany trees. Watching the endless procession of animals coming to drink at the Sabie River, establishes a sense of one's own place in the eternal cycle. In this rest camp, the bounty and most conspicuous of its numerous

trees, the mighty sycamore fig, which provides generously for the livelihood of many birds and insects. Not only do these giants produce fruit at least twice a year but different trees produce fruit at different times, extending the gifts of life over many months. Accommodation includes campsites, huts, safari tents, bungalows, family bungalows, guest cottages and guest house: Keartland.
